	Ten officials were implicated, the following four have resigned and one's term as an intern expired.		
	One employee was exonerated as his signature was found to have been forged. A criminal case under case number 90/14/18 was opened.		
	The 4 current employees have been charged and they are undergoing disciplinary processes:
