1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Ba-Phalaborwa Municipality is committed to promoting sustainable development and efficient land use management practices. This involves implementing systems and measures to ensure a coherent spatial rationale that aligns with the municipality's broader development objectives outlined in the Integrated Development Plan (IDP). The reconciliation of land use and development activities is crucial for monitoring the effectiveness of existing spatial tools and ensuring that development patterns support sustainable growth.
 - 1.2To achieve this, a comprehensive land audit is required to assess the status of all properties within the municipality's jurisdiction, enabling the creation of an integrated and accurate land use register.

2. PURPOSE

2.1 The purpose of this project is to appoint a competent service provider to conduct a Land Audit, with the goal of acquiring updated, accurate, and verified datasets on land ownership, land use, and cadastral information. This will be used to create a consolidated spatial register of all properties within Ba-Phalaborwa Municipality.

3. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Land Audit include:

- 3.2 Establishing accurate land ownership data to inform land management and development decisions.
- 3.3 Conducting a detailed investigation into current land use for each erf and comparing this with existing zoning regulations to assess compliance.
- 3.4 Identifying properties that are in violation of zoning and land use regulations.
- 3.5 Analysing vacant and underutilized land and determining ownership to develop strategies for optimal land use.
- 3.6 Identifying government-owned land with potential for better utilization by the municipality or private developers.
- 3.7 Identifying properties that are not registered with the Deeds Office due to lapsed layout plans, survey issues, or other reasons.
- 3.8 Identifying land that requires formal surveying, such as informally subdivided commonage land.
- 3.9 Identifying municipal-owned properties without title deeds.

- 3.10 Flag, record and confirm the User Department or Tenant/ Lessee in occupation for each property owned by the Municipality.
 - 3.10.1 Flag, record and report any illegal occupation/ invasion of each improved or vacant land.
 - 3.10.2 Verify and align collected data against the existing Land Use Scheme, GIS data register, General Valuation Roll (GVR)
 - 3.10.3 Developing a filing system for each erf, including essential documents such as SG diagrams and title deeds.
 - 3.10.4 Resolving conflicts between landowners through verification of displaced property pegs.
 - 3.11 Adding value to the municipal valuation roll to enhance accuracy.
 - 3.11.1 Improving municipal revenue collection by ensuring all taxable properties are identified.
 - 3.12 Developing a clean and credible cadastral dataset for the municipality.

4. STUDY AREA

The study area will encompass the entire Ba-Phalaborwa Local Municipality, including:

- State-Owned Enterprises (e.g., Telkom, Transnet, Eskom, SANRAL)
- Municipal land (District and Local)
- Provincial Government properties
- Privately owned land
- State land (National, Provincial, Traditional Authorities)
- Land with unknown ownership

Cadastral parcels to be audited include:

- Parent farms and farm portions
- Agricultural holdings
- Erven (residential, business, etc.)
- Sectional title schemes
- All proclaimed townships within the municipality

GIS Capability

• General enquiries zoning, erf number, extent, valuations etc.

- Inventory of land type (farm, erf) owned by a specific entity (private, state, provincial, municipal) used for a specific purpose (vacant, agriculture, business, residential, etc).
- Land type, extent and percentage used for a specific purpose (agriculture, business, industrial, tourism, mining etc).
- Differentiation of ownership of land types
- Differentiation extent ad percentages of land uses
- Vacant land in public or private ownership
- And type (erven) surveyed and proclaimed but not yet registered

5. PROBLEM STATEMENT AND SOLUTION PARAMETERS

The Land Audit must address key questions, including:

- How much land is vested in the municipality?
- Which areas /how much land is unsurveyed and surveyed not yet registered at the deeds?
- What are the land tenure issues are within the land that belongs to the municipality
- How much state land is controlled by traditional authorities in Ba-Phalaborwa?
- Which areas lack formal cadastral information?
- What is the distribution of land ownership between state, private, and municipal entities?
- How much land cannot be taxed due to undetermined ownership or lack of surveying?

6. SCOPE OF WORK

The Land Audit will involve creating a complete and accurate GIS-based cadastral database. This will include both registered cadastral data (from the Deeds Office) and unregistered properties (from the SG's Office). The key activities are:

- 6.2 Developing a GIS cadastral database that integrates information from both the Deeds Office and Surveyor-General (SG) Office.
- 6.2.1 Conducting a comprehensive audit of land parcels within the municipality to determine ownership and categorize it as per defined criteria.
- 6.3 Ensuring GIS functionality includes:
- Zoning, erf number, extent, and valuation queries.
- Ownership inventory by entity (private, state, provincial, municipal).
- Categorizing land by type (vacant, agricultural, business, etc.).
- Analysing land use distribution (agriculture, business, tourism, etc.).
- Identifying discrepancies between ownership and cadastral records.

- 6.4 Key data sources:
- Registrar of Deeds (property registration, sectional schemes)
- Surveyor-General (cadastral information, general plans, property diagrams)
- Municipality (valuation roll, asset register, GIS data, layout plans, LUMS)
- DARDLA (land claims, TA proclamations)

- 3) Capability to deliver a fully operational land use and ownership database within the agreed timeframe.
- 4) Advanced data analysis skills to identify discrepancies and resolve complex land ownership issues.
- 5) Compliance with relevant legislation (e.g., SPLUMA, MPRA).

TAX CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE
