1. INTRODUCTION

The Ba-Phalaborwa Local Municipality has an approved Credit Control and Debt Collection Policy and By-law which cater for indigent relief. In terms of this Policy and By-law and other relevant legislation, the Council may embark on its own debt collection actions in the first instance and in doing so may exhaust all internal measures before taking legal action against debtors. The purpose of this tender is to seek the assistance of service provider in the legal action process, to ensure that monies due and payable to the Council are collected and to provide legal assistance in matters incidental to the collection of the debt. It is the intention of the Council to award this tender to successful bidder from whom debt collection will be required from time to time for a three (3) year period.

2. DESCRIPTION OF THE SERVICES REQUIRED

1. DETAILED SCOPE OF WORK

A COMPREHENSIVE DEBT SERVICE IS REQUIRED FOCUSING ON:

The pre-legal debt collection services for the collection of revenue on overdue accounts of 90 days and above, on a commission basis, include the following:

- Debtor identification through an arrears extract or preferably through an interface with Ba-Phalaborwa Municipality's system.
- Filtering arrears information for import into the Service Provider's system,
- Also be available to be on-site twice a week to ensure thorough communication and skills transfer on debtor related matters,
- (i) Soft and hard tracing
- (ii) Letter of demand,
- (iii) Telephonic and SMS interaction with debtor,
- (iv) Negotiating acceptable payment agreements in accordance with the Credit Control and Debt Collection Policy, such agreements will apply to all debt arrangements,
- (v) Follow up on negotiated agreements,
- (vi) Identification of defaults on negotiated agreements.

The legal debt collection services for the collection of revenue on overdue accounts interpreted and handed off for legal collection, on a per service billing, include the following:

- (i) Soft and hard tracing
- (ii) Preparation of summonses
- (iii) Obtaining judgements

- *Preparation* of reports according to time frames as set out below: Monthly Reports

- (i) Arrangements made for domestic, businesses and indigents

The successful bidder must provide statistics or on request subject to budget and approval by the Accounting Officer) perform the provision for doubtful debt annually before 31 July.

Subsequent to the awarding of the tender as per above specifications the preferred bidder will be afforded the opportunity to present supplementary modules or solutions to increase the collection rate as well as the overall customer relations. A COMPREHENSIVE DEBT SERVICE IS REQUIRED FOCUSING ON:

- <u>4.1.1</u> Successful candidates, by acting as agents for the Ba-Phalaborwa Local Municipality, will be required to heed the principles and conditions of the legislation and policy, at all times when dealing with debtors.
- <u>4.1.2</u> It is a requirement of this tender that debtors be treated humanely and with the utmost empathy. The dignity of the debtors must be upheld at all times. Failure to uphold this requirement by a successful bidder will be seen as a breach of the tender process and the contract will be terminated.
- <u>4.1.3</u> The Council may, at its sole discretion, amend or temporarily suspend any of the collection processes, without any compensation being paid.
- <u>4.1.4</u> The Council will be monitoring the collection to cost ratio of work handed over and in cases where costs outweigh the collections, the Council reserves the right to withdraw the work at its sole discretion.
- <u>4.1.5</u> The Council expects a high standard of delivery and that all reasonable steps to recover the debt as speedily, cost effectively and appropriately as possible, will be instituted timeously and without undue delay. It is expected that at least the first two steps, i.e. notifying the debtor that the successful bidder will be collecting the claim on behalf of Council and a final demand, will be taken within one month of receipt of an instruction.
- <u>4.1.6</u> The successful bidder will not accept work from the Council if and when the debtor is their client; so as to avoid a conflict of interest.
- <u>4.1.7</u> This tender only applies to matters in the township's and Agricultural areas (Namakgale, Lulekani, Gravelotte & Gritjie)
- 4.1.8 Payments to Council Debtors /Customers will pay directly to the Council
- <u>4.1.9</u> The successful tenderers shall ensure that adequate staff with skills and qualifications, acceptable to the Council, will be readily available to perform these tasks.
- <u>4.1.10</u> The successful tenderer must apply its own resources in respect of offices, personnel, vehicles and equipment required.

- <u>4.1.11</u> The successful tenderer may be required to change, at own costs, existing management report formats at the request of Ba-Phalaborwa Local Municipality.
- 4.1.12 The successful tenderer must conduct its business during the business hours of Ba-Phalaborwa Local Municipality and must be easily accessible to debtors and Client officials. The successful tenderer must have a local office within the Ba-Phalaborwa Municipal area. In the event where the successful tenderer doesn't have a local office in Phalaborwa boundaries, he/she will be required to set up an office within 30 days of the inception of the tender.
 - <u>4.1.13</u> Towards the end of the expiry date of this contract, it will be necessary to implement a handover process so as to not compromise the debt collection process and to enable the Council to withstand any legal challenge. This process will be in consultation with all parties.

5 EVALUATION CRITERIA

Evaluation of Tenders

Tenderers will be pre- evaluated in terms of critical requirements and functionality of the tender submissions. Tenderers that do not conform to ALL of the minimum requirements and functionality will be deemed not responsive and only those bidders who adhere, satisfy and fore fill ALL of the core requirements and functionality will be evaluated further in terms of price and preferential points system.

TAX CLEARANCE CERTIFICATE

It is a condition of bid that the taxes of the successful bidder must be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the bidder's tax obligations.


2. DEFINITIONS

- (b) "B-BBEE status level of contributor" means the B-BBEE status of an entity in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- (c) "**bid**" means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of goods or services, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- (d) **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- (e) "EME" means an Exempted Micro Enterprise in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9 (1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;


